RISK FACTORS



Injecting drug use - current or past



Unsterile/backyard tattoos, piercing or scarrification



Shared razor blades, toothbrushes



Not practising safe sex



Unsterile medical, dental or cosmetic procedures



Blood transfusion or blood products before 1990



Communicare/health record: jaundice? previous test?



Been in prison



Fights or contact sports incidents where blood was present

KEY FACTS



There is a CURE for hep C - close to 100%



No symptoms - can be a long time before you even notice



Blood needs to be taken for the test



For most people - **no** injections. Just tablets daily for 8 or 12 weeks.



Hep C can cause liver scars, liver failure or liver cancer.



Results can take up to one week



It takes about 3 months before infections can be detected. If infection is recent, may need a second test.

ACTIONS



Appointment for follow up on progress



Regular reminders - calls or text



Recall diagnosed people who were not referred for treatment



Need support to fill script and/or pick up meds?



Recall those who have started treatment but had no follow up.



If exposure was recent, make date for another test in 3 months.
