

Registered Training Organisation Student Code of Conduct

Principles

This Code of Conduct has been developed to provide clear advice to students undertaking training with the Aboriginal Health Council of South Australia (AHCSA) on the expectations of behaviour and practice throughout their study journey.

Respect

Students are expected to behave ethically and respectfully when present in the training space and whilst undertaking workplace practice as part of their training program.

When students are in attendance of training they must act in a way that respects the rights, differences and welfare of all AHCSA students and staff. This includes, but is not limited to, refraining from harassment, abuse, intimidation, improper and inappropriate conversations and/or comments and discrimination towards all other staff or students.

Whilst students are undertaking workplace practice as part of their training program they must demonstrate behaviours of respect, trust and effective communication with colleagues, clients and community members.

Communication

Communication between students, employers, work-placement hosts and AHCSA is vital to the success of study with AHCSA. Students are responsible for ensuring direct and timely communication with RTO staff relating to their study progress, changes to contact details and questions or concerns regarding any area of their study journey.

Students must ensure ethical and respectful behaviour with all communication with the wider community when representing themselves as a student of AHCSA, such as while undertaking work-placement or health promotion activities.

Responsible Behaviour

Students undertaking workplace practice as part of their training program must always use client-centred approaches and ensure the safety of themselves, their colleagues and the client.
