## DIPHTHERIA UPDATE

As cases of diphtheria in Australia have been rising since late 2025, NACCHO CEO Dr Dawn Casey and NACCHO Medical Advisor Dr Megan Campbell have called for urgent and more timely action to vaccinate and protect all communities following the multijurisdictional outbreak affecting the Northern Territory and Western Australia in particular, but also South Australia and Queensland.

On the 21 May, Health Minister Mark Butler announced a Commonwealth funding package, which included program funding for ACCHOs in affected areas.

On the 22 May, diphtheria was declared a Communicable Disease Incident of National Significance (CDINS) by Australian Chief Medical Officer, (CMO) Dr Michael Kidd.

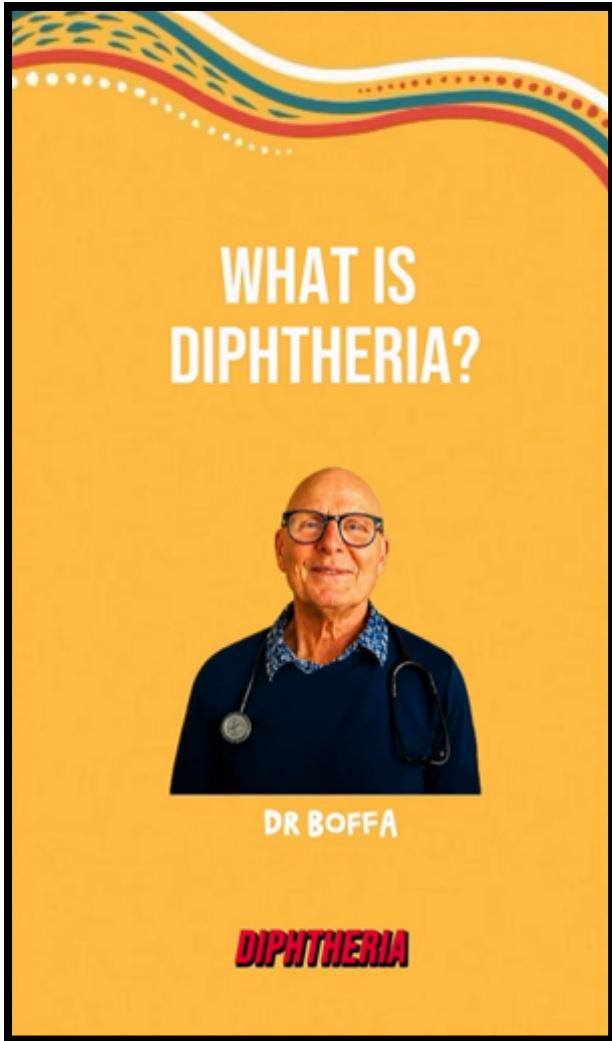

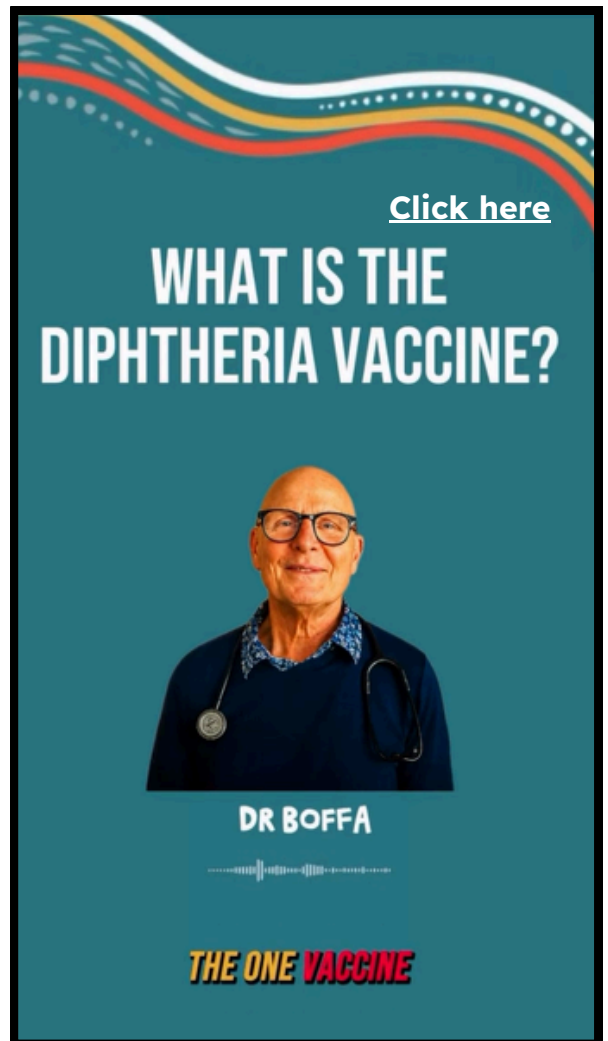

### AHCWA Health Hero Campaign, Powered by Indigiverse

Aboriginal Health Council of Western Australia (AHCWA), powered by Indigiverse as their creative and implementation partner, launched their new Health Heroes Campaign at the AHCWA conference last month.

The AHCWA Health Heroes campaign exists to strengthen positive health behaviours through storytelling, character engagement and culturally resonant edutainment. The campaign is about healthy choices, connection and community strength.

The campaign intentionally focuses on strengths, empowerment and healthy choices. Characters and stories are designed to create positive conversations and self-reflection without making audiences feel lectured, judged or disconnected. The campaign uses entertainment and storytelling to support learning so that audience feels seen, represented, entertained and empowered. Examples of key messaging include:

- "Captain Check-Up reminds us that looking after ourselves is an act of strength."
- "Shield Sista helps protect mob through positive choices and looking out for one another."
- "Small healthy actions can create powerful change."
- "Strong communities help each other stay healthy."

## NEW RESEARCH

### The 8th Australian Survey of Secondary Students and Sexual Health (SSASH 8) Australian Research Centre in Sex, Health and Society, La Trobe University.

SSASH 8 collected detailed information on young people's sexual health, including: sexually transmissible infections (STI) prevention and testing, contraceptive use, sexual health knowledge, relationships, sexual experiences, digital sexual experiences, and perceptions of school-based relationships and sexuality education (RSE).

#### Some findings of interest:

- While 80% of respondents reported that condoms were available at their last sexual experience, 51% reported that they used one at their last experience, with 26% reported that they always used condoms.
- 12% reported that they had been tested for STIs, with young women and those people living in regional or remote areas more likely to be screened.

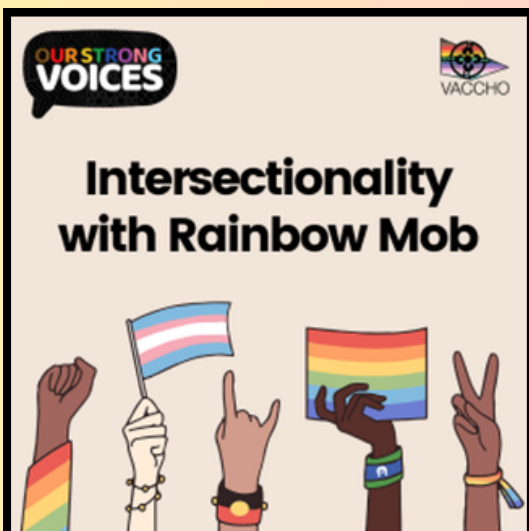

**International Day Against Homophobia, Biphobia, Intersex Discrimination, and Transphobia (IDAHOBIT)**

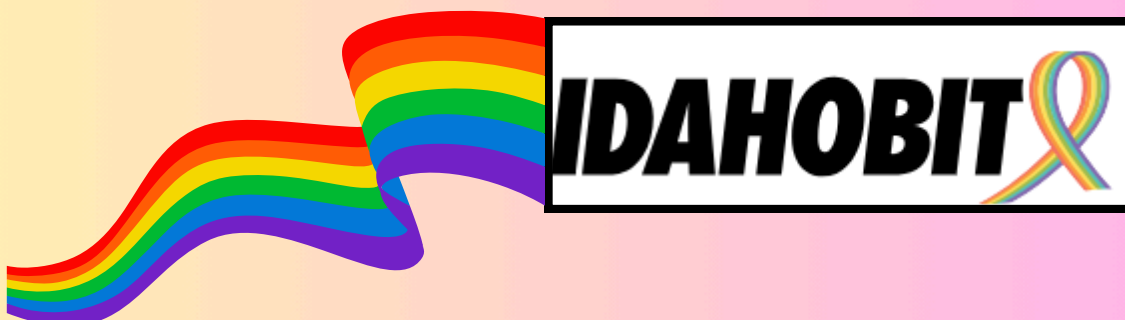
IDAHOBIT is celebrated on May 17, aligning with the World Health Organisation removing homosexuality from the Classification of Diseases in 1990.

### Syphilis PoCT Training

Training for the use of the syphilis Point of Care Test (PoCT) is available for all ACCHOs and Affiliates enrolled in the Enhanced Syphilis Response (ESR) or Blood Borne Virus and Sexually Transmissible Infections (BBVSTI) Programs.

The training includes theory and practical sections, for the practical section of training, you will need:

- Syphilis test strips
- Collection tubes
- Quality Control (QC) solution
- A bluey and gloves.

To arrange a time for training and to order consumables prior to training, contact the team by:

When booking training, our team will ask what type and level of training you will need – please see below for options:

- **Online training** is an excellent opportunity if you have new staff that need to be onboarded quickly, you have staff in remote locations, where travel may be difficult, or you want additional support for an advanced trainer at your training. NACCHO can be flexible and book this at a time which suits you.
- **In-person training** is ideal for large clinic wide training, particularly if your clinic is new to syphilis PoCT or if you need to do a large training due to staffing turnover. NACCHO will be as flexible as possible, please note this will require additional time to arrange logistics.

### Levels of Training:

- **Operator Training** – syphilis education, client testing, quality management
- **Advanced Training** – all the content of the operator training, plus content for the train the trainer model, where staff can be trained to on train other staff within your ACCHO.

Syphilis PoCT Training is endorsed by NAATSIHWP and accredited with 2.5 CPD hours.



## SYPHILIS PoCT CONSUMABLE ORDERS

### Are you in the ESR and/or BBVSTI Program and enrolled in Syphilis Point of Care Testing?

Place your order for syphilis Point of Care Testing (PoCT) consumables (see ordering links below).

If you are new to the role and unsure of how much to order, NACCHO can support you in placing an order considering your previous history of ordering and your upcoming events.

This is also your reminder to review your stock levels and expiry dates of your syphilis PoCT consumables, including:

- Syphilis Test Strips
- Chase Buffer
- Collection Tubes
- Quality Control (QC) solution - you will only need 1 box per year, each bottle lasts 4 months once open.

## PROGRAM REPORTING

### Contracts for ESR and BBVSTI Programs

NACCHO has recently signed a contract with the Australian Centre for Disease Control (CDC) to continue to deliver the Enhanced Syphilis Response (ESR) and Blood Borne Viruses and Sexually Transmissible Infections (BBVSTI) Programs for three years commencing from July 1 2026.

The NACCHO team is now finalising offers for enrolment to ACCHOs for the Programs. A webinar to assist enrolled ACCHOs in writing Activity Workplans, Budgets, Risk Management Plans scheduled for July 1 (see the NACCHO Webinars page).

NACCHO is also in discussions with the Australian Centre for Disease Control (CDC) on funding to support actions to engage pregnant people in care to reduce the incidence of congenital syphilis.

### BBVSTI & ESR Current Contract Final Reporting

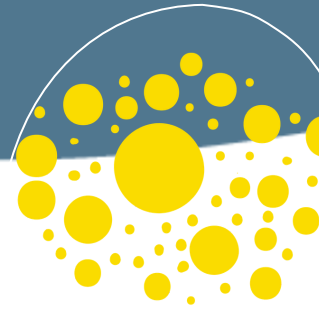
Final reporting is due on 31 July 2026, which includes:

- Final Progress Report for the 1 January – 30 June 2026.
- Final Reporting Evaluation Question Report for the entire Program.
- Financial Acquittal for the 2025-26 Financial Year and roll forward requests for unspent funds:
  - BBVSTI Program is due 31 July 2026.
  - ESR Program is due 15 August 2026.

The aim of the final reporting evaluation questions is to capture your program achievements, successes, and challenges, reflecting on the outcomes delivered under your Activity Workplan for the period of your Contract. This report along with the 2025-26 financial acquittal are the final contract requirements for current contracts.

**BBVSTI & ESR Program Data Reporting**

**Important Update – ESR syphilis Point of Care Central Communicare Clinical Item**

For services currently using the Central syphilis POC Test Communicare Clinical Item, there is an important update.

A revised SQL report is now required for use with the Central Clinical Item. This update corrects an issue where the previous version may return an incorrect summary of syphilis test results.

**What you need to do:**

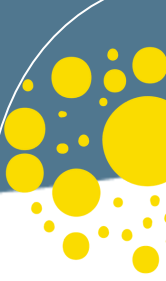
